Method: Subject + 1st Form of Verb + Object

- **s/es** is added for the third person singular (he, she, it) and other singular nouns **Example**:
 - He goes to Lahore.
 - She writes a story.
 - She watches television.

Negative Sentence

Method: Subject + do/does not +1st Form of Verb + Object

- Do is used with I, We, You, They
- Does is used with He, She, It and other singular nouns.

Example:

- I do not read stories.
- He does not catch fish.
- They do not write.

Interrogative Sentences
